Duck races raise funds for special care babies

A charity which teaches babies and young children to swim held swimming races to raise funds for special care babies.

Turtle Tots Edinburgh and East Lothian raised £11,246 for the charity Simpsons Special Care Babies taking their fundraising four year total to over £20,000.

They held 102 duck races over a week in October. The swimmers aged 12 weeks to five years-old all raised money for the charity which many have had direct contact with in their young lives.

Director of Turtle Tots Edinburgh, Karina commented: "Simpson's Special Care Babies has provided vital support to many of our swimmers, and personally to my friends and family members. With a current fundraising target of £300,000, I was keen that through Turtle Tots, we could help get them a step nearer to that target.

"I'm completely overwhelmed by the enthusiasm and generosity shown by these families. Every single one of our little swimmers has embraced the challenge and have had loads of fun in the process. It's amazing the funds that can be raised when you all pull together."

One of the top fundraisers was Jed Heeps who was supported by the unit when he was born on New Year's Day at 26 weeks, weighing just 2lbs, 2oz.
