Craig Ogilvie from North Berwick leads the title chase with 34 points with Jamie McHale (Gifford) second on 26 points with Dunbar-based Chris Empson third two points further back.

Edinburgh-based David Cooper is fourth on 18 points with David Morrison and Alan Brown joint fifth with 14 points.

Fairbairn has ten points following his win in the sixth round with Haddington angler James Ogilvie seventh with eight

points.

Barry McEwan (Port Seton), the Summer League winner, and Ryan Barnett (Penicuik) have six points are joint eighth with Portobello angler Thomas Slow and Dale McCallum (Port Seton) ninth with four points each.

Record keeper James Ogilvie said: "These are the halfway results and the lads still have all to fish for."
