## On Australia Day — bushfire fundraiser at the Globe

This year's Australian Day celebration at Edinburgh's Globe Bar is to be a fundraiser for the ongoing bushfire relief efforts.

"It's a day when they also reminisce about back home. This year will be more emotional than usual given the disastrous fires sweeping the country and we are pleased to do our little bit to help.
