This is in the village of Temple in Midlothian, the headquarters of the Knights Templar during the 14th century. Their ruined church stands opposite Shillinghill Studios in the rural setting.

Opening her own studio/gallery allows Alison to show her glass in a unique setting. It also means that visitors can see the development of an idea into a finished work, as well as experimental and personal pieces. A number of new works have come directly out of the Covid 19 situation, and express feelings of isolation or of hope, that are common to all of us at this time.

Shillinghill is a large and airy building with beautiful

spaces in which to show the work, and has a natural one-way flow, so visitors can be assured that all precautions will be taken for a safe and comfortable welcome. If people would prefer a private view, this can be arranged, and appointments made by telephone are welcome during August and thereafter.
