Police report fall in violent crime and increase in number of recovered knives

Police officers in the capital have taken a greater number of knives off the streets during the first quarter of 2020/21.

Chief Superintendent Sean Scott said: "DCC Fiona Taylor has made clear, the first quarter period of 2020/21 is extremely unprecedented, given the restrictions placed on the public's movements. As such, we must not be tempted to jump to hasty conclusions on crime trends at this time.
