In addition to classroom activity Hibernian Community Foundation Staff also deliver Score Goals- An after school programme which includes a football session, healthy living workshop and a healthy meal with friends. Hibernian Community Foundation have delivered Score Goals to over 70 school children this year in addition to the 250 children we have worked with across Elphinstone Primary School, St Gabriel's Primary School, Preston Tower Primary School and Hermitage Park Primary School.

Hibs Class Lead and Hibernian Community Foundation Development Manager Lewis Melee added — 'I am delighted to see Hibs Class gain this award, we have been developing Hibs Class content and school relationships for some time now and we have really enjoyed supporting student development across our partner schools.
