In 2017 he returned to The Buddies and is widely credited as being an inspirational figure in their unlikely escape from relegation to Scotland's third tier, before going on to win the title in the following campaign.

He is already a familiar face at Easter Road, having regularly joined the rest of his family over the years to support brothers John and Paul and we look forward to Stephen following in their footsteps and making his own mark on the club.

Head Coach Jack Ross told Hibernian Media: "For me, Stephen adds a lot to the group and the environment at HTC.

"You can never have enough good professionals with leadership qualities and we're fortunate, as I've said repeatedly, to have a great core of those at Hibernian."
