Hibs travel to Glasgow knowing that a victory would see them leapfrog Celtic into second place and the midfielder is looking forward to his first appearance at the stadium.

He has been in fine form this season and is enjoying his role in the centre of midfield where he has been able to get forward and score goals.

Speaking at the pre-match press conference yesterday, Newell said: "We have had a good start. A few people had been saying that we hadn't played any of the Old Firm yet as we had a good start to the season in terms of fixtures but we showed last

week that we are a good team.

"We feel we should be up that side of the table and we go into the Celtic game full of confidence after last week.
