We also involved pupils from Crail and Kingsbarns Primary Schools in some themed home learning activities about rainbows, plants and gardens."

"The Prairie garden feature a vast array of striking grasses. Together with the herbaceous borders, it's a key feature of the autumn season in the garden, which has year round interest thanks to the hard work of our Garden Team."

Taking place between September and December, Cambo Gardens will be holding eight different "Makers Markets Weekends", promoting locally sourced crafts, artisan foods, products and gifts, with the craft makers present to discuss their wares.

And on 10th and 11th October there will be an Autumn Plant & Produce Market, showcasing Cambo Gardens celebrated seasonal plant, fruit and vegetable selections.
