Five individuals within the Police Scotland family have been recognised for exceptional and outstanding public service as part of the Queen's Birthday Honours.

Recently retired Chief Superintendents Campbell Thomson and Hazel Hendren receive the Queen's Police Service Medal (QPM), the highest honour awarded for policing service.
