Hibs created several chances and Charlotte Potts struck the bar with a looping header which left former team mate Jenna Fife wrong footed then shortly after Rangers scored Fife produced a superb save to deny Rachael Boyle.

The result sees Hibs drop from second place to fourth and they face league leaders Glasgow City then Celtic in the next two weeks.

After the game Gibson said: "I'm proud of every single player in a green strip today. We didn't deserve to lose that game. I think in these type of games someone loses by the odd goal and today we were on the wrong side of it.

"I'm absolutely gutted for the players. To put that amount of effort and work rate into the game then to lose it is devastating but we will pick ourselves up and we will go again at training on Tuesday.
