Fifteen Edinburgh trade union organisations will lay wreaths including NUJ, UNISON, FBU,UCU, UNITE and EIS branches between 12 and 2pm.

Floral trinutes will also be laid by the Protest in Harmony choir, Migrant Pride and Scottish Hazards.


