Festival on the hunt for a new boss

Edinburgh International Festival begins the search for its next Festival Director, who will launch their programming and curatorial vision at the 2023 Festival.

Current Festival Director, Fergus Linehan, completes his tenure in September 2022 after an exceptional eight-year period, during which time he has reaffirmed the Festival's position as the world's leading performing arts festival.

One of the most obvious ways Linehan has changed the festival is by introducing more contemporary music and artists since he first took up the reins. He also engaged the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra to bring classical music to Tynecastle in the opening event in 2019. We have enjoyed light shows over several years from the dizzy heights of Edinburgh Castle to last year's My Light Shines On — a triumph during the pandemic.

Created in 1947 to celebrate the enduring human spirit, the International Festival serves as an annual cultural exchange, every August, for an international gathering of artists and an audience of over 400,000.

This year the Festival is pioneering the return to live performance in Scotland from 7-29 August 2021, with over 170 performances across three bespoke outdoor venues, as well as the Festival Theatre, Traverse Theatre, The Royal Lyceum Theatre and Dance Base.
