
## Small Business Saturday — home in on Dovecot


This year's Small Business Saturday takes place on 4 December when small businesses in Scotland look for some support.

This Saturday GLOW21 at Dovecot Studios offers visitors the chance to buy their Christmas gifts from local, independent businesses and makers.

"GLOW is a direct selling event featuring the work of makers from across Scotland from a mix of disciplines including jewellers, textile designers, ceramicists, accessory makers and beyond," Edinburgh-based weaver and organiser of GLOW21, James Donald explained.

Mr Donald added: "The GLOW event was organised as a result of a perceived lack of quality direct selling shows for Scotland's leading designer makers that put makers at the heart of the process of organising a selling event that spoke of quality, originality and affordability in a distinctive space, the Dovecot Studios, within the heart of Edinburgh."
