However, if you choose to receive an online post master's nurse practitioner certification, it gives you a more individualized opportunity to specialize in a more focused area of nursing. This gives many nursing professionals the opportunity to study something other than what their degree was for, or to switch to the area of nursing that they are more passionate about.
