However, once you arrive in Barcelona and intend to stay there

for more than 90 days, you will have to acquire an NIE number that acts as a foreigner's tax and identification number. With an NIE, you can apply for a bank account, enter a work agreement, and access other important services in the country.

Non-EU citizens

If you are from a non-EU country, you must have a visa. There are different types of visas you can get depending on what you will do in Barcelona. Below are some visas you can acquire if you are a non-EU citizen.

Work visa

If you want to go and work in Barcelona, you will need to get a work visa. However, you must first secure an employment contract before applying for this visa. Luckily there are many jobs in Barcelona so getting one is relatively easy. With a working visa, you can live and work in that city.

Non-lucrative visa (NLV) Spain

Alternatively, if you don't have a job offer, you can apply for an NLV that allows you to move and live in any part of Spain. However, to apply for a non-lucrative visa, you must prove sufficient funds to sustain your stay in the country. With this visa, you can bring your family and don't have to invest in the country. Also, with the Non Lucrative visa Spain, you can easily transition to a work permit after living in Spain for one year. But it's good to note that an NVL does not allow you to work there.

Golden visa Spain

If you are wealthy, you can move to Barcelona using a Golden visa. You will need to make an investment option to qualify for a Spanish Golden visa. You can either invest in Spanish real estate or public debt, buy company shares, or deposit in a Spanish bank. The benefit of acquiring a Spanish Golden visa

is that it doesn't tie you to reside in the country for you to renew this visa. Also, you can work and enjoy the Spanish health and education System. Furthermore, if you want to live in Barcelona, you become eligible for permanent residence after five years.

Student Visa

If you want to go and study in Barcelona, you must apply for a student visa. Furthermore, the city boasts some of the most prestigious learning institutions, from international and British schools to private schools. You can apply for a student visa if participating in an exchange program or studying at an institution in Spain.

Family reunification visa

If you are related or married to a Spanish citizen, you can apply for a family reunification visa to move to Barcelona.

Entrepreneur visa Spain
