But we believe the best pop music always comes from guitars, we're big champions of guitar music in general, there's enough rap and dance out there to last a million lifetimes! Haha.

"The band is all about being uplifting and inspiring people to just be who they want to be. And seeing all these news faces chanting "WE ARE THE MOB!' back at you at the top of their lungs, with pure passion and joy, that's what music is all about. Connecting with people.
