Mr Incredible - 14/1

With a strong performance at the <u>Cheltenham Festival</u> and a penchant for staying tests, Mr Incredible is a promising choice, particularly as he will carry a lighter weight at the Grand National.

Any Second Now - 14/1

As last year's runner-up, Any Second Now is a formidable contender. However, he will need to overcome the challenge of a more substantial weight to succeed this year.

Gaillard Du Mesnil - 16/1

Another Cheltenham winner, Gaillard Du Mesnil brings star power to the Irish challenge and is a popular choice among bettors.

Longhouse Poet - 20/1

As a proven stayer with a good record, Longhouse Poet may offer an attractive return for those willing to take a chance on a less-favoured contender.

Le Milos -20/1

Having won two of his three starts for Dan Skelton, Le Milos is versatile on various ground types, making him an appealing option for those seeking an adaptable contender.

Vanillier - 20/1

Despite some concerns about his jumping abilities, Vanillier's recent performance behind Kemboy and eye-catching grey coat make him a potential dark horse in the race.

Our Power -20/1

With two wins this season, Our Power's campaign appears tailored for the Grand National, making him a popular choice among bettors.

An In-Depth Look at the Favourites

National 2023 promises to be another thrilling and unpredictable race, with a number of top contenders looking to make their mark at <u>Aintree</u>. We have already highlighted some of the featured horses, now let's take a closer look at some other potential winners with impressive profiles and statistics.

Corach Rambler, a 9-year-old trained by Lucinda Russell, is heading to Aintree with good form after securing back-to-back victories in the Ultima Handicap Chase at Cheltenham Festival. With a racing weight of just 10st 5lbs and the experience of Russell's 2017 Grand National-winning yard behind him, Corach

Rambler is a strong favourite. However, only three horses that won at the Cheltenham Festival the same season have gone on to win the Grand National since 1961, so it's a trend to watch.

The reigning champion, **Noble Yeats**, defied the odds and an 80-year history as a 7-year-old to win the 2022 Grand National. Now aged 8, he's coming into his prime with fond memories of the Aintree fences. However, he will likely face the challenge of carrying more weight and having a different rider on board.

Delta Work, a 10-year-old trained by Gordon Elliott, finished in a respectable third place in his first attempt at the Aintree obstacles. He represents the powerful Elliott/Gigginstown combo that won the National twice with Tiger Roll in recent years, making him one of the leading players.

Predictions for the Grand National

When it comes to Grand National predictions, discerning punters should rely on trusted sources such as experienced tipsters and Grand National experts. Though favourites win about 35% of horse races on average, this win percentage can vary based on factors such as distance, surface, and class. Therefore, it's essential to consider various factors to make informed betting decisions for the 2023 Grand National.

Age is a significant factor when evaluating Grand National horses, as younger horses tend to have more speed, while older ones have more stamina. Horses usually perform best in the Grand National between the ages of 8 and 11. Examining the race's history, 24 of the last 31 winners were aged 9 or older, emphasising the importance of age in predicting winners.

Weight plays a crucial role in determining a horse's performance in the Grand National. Of the last 31 winners, 24 carried 10st 13lbs or less, demonstrating the importance of

weight as a factor in making predictions. Grand National tipsters closely analyse this aspect when making their recommendations.

Previous experience is another essential factor to consider when evaluating Grand National contenders. Horses that have displayed competitiveness in listed races or the Irish and Welsh Grand Nationals should not be overlooked. Additionally, having prior experience navigating the Grand National fences is a significant advantage.

Stamina is vital for long-distance races like the Grand National, which spans over four miles and typically lasts around nine minutes. As the Grand National takes place shortly after the demanding Cheltenham Festival, horses need to be in peak form to recover and enter the race with a winning mindset. In fact, 27 of the last 31 Grand National winners had previously participated in a chase race of at least 3 miles.

Examining other Grand National trends and identifying the best profile of previous winners can also help make more accurate predictions. The Virtual Grand National, for example, combines these factors and trends in a visual format and has enjoyed a fair amount of success in predicting outcomes.

As the 2023 Grand National approaches, many punters will be keen to use their free bets and make informed decisions based on predictions and analysis of various factors, such as age, weight, previous experience, and stamina. However, it's crucial to remember that the Grand National is an unpredictable race, and sometimes it's better not to always go for the favourites.
