Fatal Accident Inquiry

A Fatal Accident Inquiry (FAI) has been set for 11 April at Edinburgh Sheriff Court into the death of Xander Irvine who was three when the driver of a car, Edith Duncan drove into him and killed him. Xander's mother Victoria was also hurt in the incident which took place on Morningside Road.

Mrs Duncan was subsequently charged by police but died before any trial was held following the incident in June 2020.



Pic taken 30/6/2020 Picture Alan Simpson Xander Irvine (3) was killed by a car driven by Edith Duncan (91) who died in May 2021 before she could stand trial. Prosecutors have ruled Xander's death occurred in 'circumstances giving rise to serious public concern' and a fatal accident inquiry will now take place at Edinburgh Sheriff Court. A virtual preliminary hearing has been set for April 11.

Webinar for Fearless Women

Girls from Edinburgh are being given the opportunity to be inspired by successful women in a free online webinar series.

On 19 March at 6pm, the guest speaker in the "Fearless Women" webinar series is Christine Middlemiss, Chief Veterinary Officer of the United Kingdom who will be hosted by <u>St George's School</u> in Edinburgh to coincide with 150 years of the Girls' Schools Association.
