

Liverpool FC and the Road to Success: An In-Depth Look at The Reds' Excellent 23/24 Season Thus Far

Liverpool have demonstrated their exceptional form at several moments during this season, showcasing their fluid style of play. We will now examine these highlights further to appreciate the impressive performance of Jurgen Klopp's team.

The Reds presently occupy the top position in the Premier League table, having suffered a solitary defeat in their first 20 matches. [Liverpool](#) now maintains a three-point advantage over Aston Villa, who are in second place. This potentially positions Liverpool favourably to secure the title from Pep Guardiola's team.

Jurgen Klopp's team now maintains a five-point advantage over Manchester City. However, the German manager believes it would be unwise to dismiss Guardiola's team from the competition for the championship.

Although Klopp has chosen not to comment on Liverpool's prospects of winning the Premier League title, it is evident that the team is now in a favourable position to kick off the New Year.

Upon careful examination of Liverpool and their performance thus far, we have identified some remarkable statistics that demonstrate Klopp's team has returned to its peak form this season.

Most Impressive Statistics from Liverpool in the 2023/24 Season:

- Liverpool's current average points per game is 2.25, and it is projected that they will end the season with 86 points. In terms of perspective, that would be Liverpool's fourth-highest accumulation of points under the management of Klopp.
- Liverpool has scored in all but one of their 20 Premier League fixtures this term. Tottenham is the only other squad who can better this record.
- This season, the Reds have accumulated 15 points from situations in which they were losing, surpassing the achievements of any other team in the Premier League regarding this statistic.
- Liverpool has generated an expected goals (xG) value of 46.31, surpassing all other teams in the Premier League.

No other team in Europe's top five divisions have generated a greater xG.

- Liverpool has scored 43 goals in the Premier League this season, second only to Manchester City's 45 goals. Klopp's team is presently forecasted to achieve 86 goals this season, which is 11 higher than their previous season tally.
- Liverpool has the highest goal difference in the Premier League this season, with a +25.
- In their recent 4-2 dismantling of Newcastle United, Liverpool are now the sole side in the past seven Premier League seasons to make an effort of 34 or more shots in a single match.
- Liverpool are undefeated at Anfield across all competitions – **EPL, League Cup, Europa League** – this season.

Liverpool's Cup success matches their domestic dominance

The current frontrunners of the Premier League have an opportunity to significantly advance towards the Carabao Cup final as they face Fulham in the initial match of a two-part semi-final this week. Additionally, they convincingly defeated Arsenal in an away match in the FA Cup and have secured a

place in the round of 16 draw for the Europa League.

FA Cup victory: A huge green flag

Liverpool's advancement in the FA Cup with a 2-0 victory over Arsenal was spectacular and indicative of their strong position as genuine contenders in four competitions this season. This is further emphasised by the notable absence of many key players from the Emirates match.

Notwithstanding the absence of key players like Salah, Endo, Dijk, Matip, Robertson, and others, Liverpool managed to secure their spot in the fourth round because of Klopp's team's considerable strength and depth.

Liverpool now holds the top position in the Premier League standings. However, their ability to overcome manpower limitations, as seen in their last match against Arsenal, indicates the qualities of a victorious squad and probable champions.

Liverpool's resilience will undoubtedly face challenges in the upcoming weeks. Despite the absence of important players, emerging victorious in a single game, even against a formidable side like Arsenal, is an accomplishment in itself. However, maintaining this level of success over an extended duration is an entirely different and more demanding test.

However, Liverpool is a genuine and formidable team. They avoided the exhausting consequences of a tiebreaking rematch by winning this match.

In the 2020-2021 season, Klopp's team participated in 63 matches, which is the highest number achievable, due to their appearances in the EFL Cup, FA Cup, and UCL finals. If they reach the two domestic finals and the Europa League final, they can replicate their previous success.

The victory over Arsenal was the 30th match of their season,

which means that if they maintain the same level of effort as they did two years ago, they have not yet reached the midpoint of their campaign. However, Liverpool has the necessary depth to accomplish this task, and once their currently absent players return, their team will become even more formidable.
