

Log cabin hits the right note

A Scottish video producer who is behind the Scotdisc record and video label, one of Scotland's most successful and the subject of a recent BBC Scotland documentary, has become the one hundredth customer of Scotland's leading log cabin and garden building supplier, Log House Scotland.

Dougie Stevenson along with his wife Lati, purchased an Eco Garden Room from Log House Scotland to use as a music studio/office in their garden.

Dougie set up the label with his business partner, Bill Garden, forty years ago.

“Needless to say, running the label generates a lot of admin for us, as we receive messages from all over the globe about our music,” added Dougie. “Now, with the Garden Room, everything can be looked after from here – it’s made life a lot easier and we feel so much more organised.”

“Another bonus, particularly for my wife, is that I can play any of my steel guitars out in the Garden Room, coming up with new melodies, and just generally enjoying myself, without disturbing her.” said Dougie.

Dougie visited Log House Scotland at the company’s purpose built showroom and sales centre within Caulders Garden Centre in Cumbernauld.
