

Six Edinburgh building projects shortlisted for prestigious awards

Projects ranging from a low carbon housing development to the Scottish Galleries have been revealed as finalists in the RICS (Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors) Awards Scotland 2024.

The shortlisted entries for the awards will be considered by an expert judging panel, chosen across five categories – Residential Development, Community Benefit, Heritage, Public Sector, Refurbishment-Revitalisation.

The six entries in Edinburgh are:-

- Whole House Retrofit Works at Harvesters Way (Refurbishment/Revitalisation Project)
- Rowanbank Gardens low carbon living housing development (Residential Development)
- Scottish Galleries at the National (Refurbishment/Revitalisation Project)
- Granton Station modern office space (Refurbishment/Revitalisation Project)
- Fairburn Tower (Heritage Project)
- Waverley Square housing development. (Residential Development)
