## Lawson stars as Berwick bounce back

Richard Lawson proved a sound choice as guest for crocked No 1 Lewis Kerr as he guided Berwick Bandits to a confidence-boosting win in the quarter-final, first-leg of the Cab Direct Knockout Cup.

He added: "They were just never going to give up and I never doubted they would take the points.Everyone did their bit. Young Max James was having engine trouble towards the end, but I wanted to keep him in the rides because he deserved the encouragement."

Josh Pickering, Monarchs' No 1, was in gear and so was Justin Sedgmen and another plus for Harkess was Kye Thomson who produced his best display since the last Berwick visit in July 2023.

Pickering said that he wanted to see Monarchs fans with smiles on their faces and, after this display, the home support must have drifted into the night after the meeting boosted by what they saw.
