Monarchs boss Harkess praises 'exceptional' Pickering

Stellar Monarchs' team manager, Alex Harkess, reflected on their midweek defeat at Glasgow Tigers and admitted: "Josh (Pickering) carried the team."

Crocked Justin Sedgmen was missing and there were no guest options available for Monarchs who skidded to a 50-40 defeat despite a sensational 20-point haul from Pickering and Harkess said: "It was a shame really we couldn't do more.
