The transition from a conventional gardening business model to one based on cargo bikes and electric tools was not merely a logistical shift but also a conceptual overhaul. The business model of The Cycling Gardeners was built around sustainability and efficiency.

The company invested in electric cargo bikes for transportation and electric tools for gardening tasks, partly with the help of a grant from SPOKES the Lothian Cycle Campaign.

This not only reduced their carbon footprint but also

addressed the logistical challenges of navigating Edinburgh's busy streets and limited parking spaces. Beyond technological innovations, The Cycling Gardeners employed various ecofriendly garden maintenance practices. These include the use of peat-free compost, minimal mineral fertilizers, and organic methods for weed and pest control.
