Carnegie are tenth.

Elsewhere, Uddingston are fifth in the 12-strong table after they beat Hillhead 5-2 in Lanarkshire. Hilhead are now sixth.

Statistics show that Jamie Golden of Western is the top marksman with six so far and he is closely followed by teammate Fraser Moran with four.

Five players are on three, David Nairn and Dylan Bean both (Grange), Rob Harwood and Adam McKenzie (both Western) and Matthew Leiper of Watsonians.
