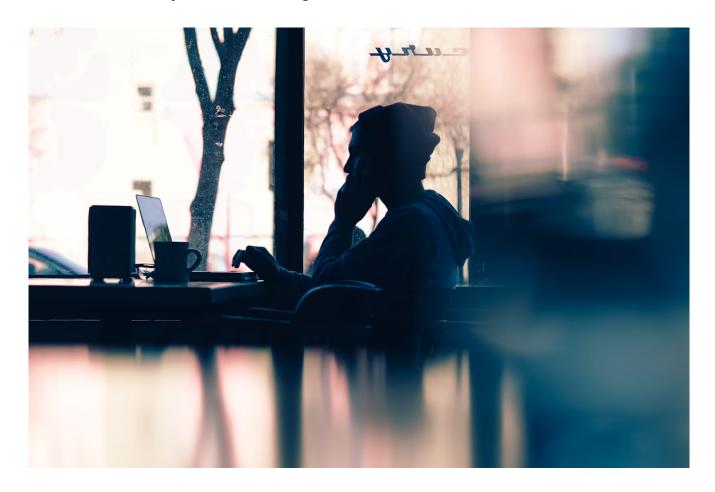
#### a. The Elephant House
