

How to Delete Messages on iPhone from Both Sides: The Complete Guide

Can You Delete Messages on iPhone from Both Sides?

When it comes to deleting messages on an iPhone from both sides, the answer depends on the type of message and the version of iOS you're using.

With regular text messages, the possibility of having this deleted from the recipient's phone is nil. Once you send an SMS, it will remain on both phones until the recipient manually deletes it. Unfortunately, even text messages go through your carrier and therefore can't be erased remotely. But if you're using the iMessage feature on iOS 16 or even newer, well, here is some good news. You can undo sending a message so that it really disappears from both your device and the recipient's device, but you'll need to do it within 30 minutes of sending. After this time, the message will remain on both devices.

You can also delete the iMessages from both sides with the iCloud feature for syncing, but then you and the recipient need to have iMessage enabled on iCloud. That will make sure the messages get deleted from both devices, provided they are synced properly.

How to Delete Messages on iPhone from Both Sides

You can delete some messages from your iPhone and from the recipient's device, but it normally depends on the type of message and the version of iOS on which you are. So, here goes what you can do:

1.) Using the “Undo Send” Feature (iOS 16 and Later)

So, if you’re running the iOS 16 or later version of iMessage, you have within 30 minutes of having sent the message to delete it from both devices:

1. Open the Messages application.
2. Locate the message you would like to delete.
3. Long press the message bubble, then tap Undo Send.

This removes the [message](#) from both your device and the recipient’s but works only if they haven’t already read it.

2.) Using iCloud to Delete iMessages from Both Devices

You can also sync messages with iCloud, which can help delete messages across all devices. This method requires both you and the recipient to have iCloud syncing enabled for Messages:

1. Enable Messages in iCloud: Go to Settings > [your name] > iCloud, and turn on Messages.
2. Open the chat, long press the message, and click More.
3. Tap and select the messages you want to delete, then tap on the trash icon.

This, once deleted, should remove the message from both devices, provided both have iCloud enabled.

Limitations

Note that these methods apply to iMessages only, that is, the blue bubble messages. Once regular SMS messages, with their green-colored bubbles, have already been sent, it is not

possible to delete them from the recipient's device.

With these features, you can easily manage messages on your iPhone and control your privacy a little better.
