Hibs keeper Jordan Smith signs contract extension

Hibs goalkeeper Jordan Smith has signed an extension to his contract and will now stay at the club until the summer of 2028.

Smith joined Hibs last summer after leaving Stockport County and initially played back up to fellow keeper Josef Bursik.

After taking over the goalkeeping role, the 30-year-old has kept six clean sheets in 19 appearances this season, and has now extended his stay in the Scottish capital.
