Skyscanner: A Unicorn Born in Scotland

Founded in 2003 by IT professionals Gareth Williams, Barry Smith, and Bonamy Grimes, Skyscanner began as a solution to simplify travel. The company developed into a leading travel aggregator, offering comprehensive flight, hotel, and car rental comparisons. By 2016, Skyscanner was acquired by China's Trip.com Group for £1.4 billion, marking one of Scotland's most significant tech exits.

FanDuel: Changing the Gaming Industry

Launched in 2009 in Edinburgh, FanDuel revolutionized the fantasy sports industry with its daily fantasy sports platform. The company rapidly expanded in the U.S. market, collecting millions of users and becoming a known player. In 2018, FanDuel merged with Paddy Power Betfair (now Flutter Entertainment), further strengthening its status in the gaming industry.
