Replay is an intimate, moving and ultimately uplifting new monologue, written by Nicola Wren (501 Things I Do In My Bedroom) and brought to you by Edinburgh Fringe favourites DugOut Theatre (Swansong, The Sunset Five, Fade, Inheritance Blues).

This is the story of a woman revisiting her childhood, coming to terms with the significant pain of her past and finally realising that she needs to embrace the memory of her brother in order to move on with her life. Heart, honesty and humour are at the core of this moving play in which Wren explores what it is to grow up, accept loss, be vulnerable and celebrate the past, however painful.

Beautifully directed by DugOut Theatre's George Chilcott and heightened by Max Perryment's intricate sound design, alongside Linbury Prize winner Jen McGinley's set design and lighting design by Tom Kitney, Replay is the kind of play that will stay with you for a long time.

Wren said; "I'm fascinated by the lengths people go to in order to hide pain and vulnerability, especially when they feel it's embarrassing, 'silly' or insignificant in comparison to what's going on in the rest of the world. I wanted to create a character who has, subconsciously, made life choices

that allow her to avoid thinking about her feelings. As a police officer she is able to remain calm in a crisis but buried deep behind her façade is a wide-eyed little girl who desperately misses her older brother. She needs to come to terms with her past in order to move onto her future."

Director George Chilcott stated; "Replay is a play about loss and coming to terms with loss. It touchingly speaks to anyone who has experienced loss — be that a death in the family or a break up. Watching 501 Things I do In My Bedroom (Nicola's last play), I was drawn to the honesty and humour in Nicola's writing — she writes from the heart and, therefore, has the ability to profoundly move her audience."

Update on Musselburgh Racecourse

The situation at Musselburgh Racecourse is that there may be racing next Friday 14 July 2017 following a climbdown by The Musselburgh Joint Racing Committee MJRC.

The temporary licence granted by the British Horseracing Association BHA ran out last Friday amid demands by the BHA that the governance of the East Lothian Racecourse was reviewed.

✓ Until Thursday there was no move by the MJRC who had planned to hold a meeting next week — which would have been too late to allow the fixture in 14 July to proceed.

Then at the eleventh hour, Councillor Willie Innes, Council Leader and Chair of the MJRC issued his statement: "I have now been able to ascertain that no member of the Musselburgh Joint Racing Committee is opposed to an independent governance review. I have therefore this afternoon informed the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) that the MJRC agrees to an independent governance review in relation to Musselburgh Racecourse.

"On behalf of the MJRC, I have asked East Lothian Council to commission such an independent review.

"I am grateful to the BHA for their ongoing engagement on these matters. My priority is to safeguard the future of racing at Musselburgh and I have been working to progress matters quickly and constructively.

"I look forward to convening the next meeting of the MJRC and

expect that the council and BHA will maintain dialogue to progress matters.

"I hope that the BHA will now be able to grant an extension to the racecourse's licence — providing welcome certainty for employees and race-goers alike."

Set in the mid-century American Southwest and inspired by the music of Hank Williams, Roy Orbison, and Patsy Cline, Lula del Ray is a mythic reinvention of the classic coming-of-age story.

Manual Cinema co-artistic director Julia Miller said: "The original inspiration for this show came from my desire to make a narrative from the perspective of a strong female protagonist. It was also the first project that brought the artistic directors together and resulted in us forming Manual Cinema. Lula has been through many iterations and has grown up with us as we grew up as a company. It's a coming of age story from the female perspective and we are thrilled to bring it to the Edinburgh Fringe for its UK premiere."
