

Beatrice Gibson: taking American author William Gaddis' epic modernist masterpiece **JR** (1975) as its departure point, **Crippled Symmetries** is a new film by Beatrice Gibson. An eerily prescient, biting social satire that turns the American Dream on its head, JR tells the story of a precocious 11 year old capitalist who inadvertently creates the single greatest financial empire the decade has seen, spun largely from the invisible confines of the school payphone. Using the novel as a score for its production, and orientated around an experimental workshop for children, the film also draws on the work of radical educators and composers Brian Dennis and John Paynter, who infamously took the work of Cornelius Cardew, John Cage and Karlheinz Stockhausen into primary and secondary schools and were at the forefront of radical post-war utopian shifts towards child-centered pedagogy. Did you know that you can now charge your phone at the new bus shelters on Princes Street provided by advertising company JCDecaux in a deal with The City of Edinburgh Council.

Now you no longer need to run out of power on the move. Just sit down in the shelter and plug in to one of the USB ports you will find there.

USB charging points are available on 11 of the stops along the north side of Princes Street, and one outside Waverley

Station, which have been upgraded as part of a 10-year partnership with advertising company JCDecaux.

On Princes Street they will feature digital advertising screens providing tourism, local and Council information, forming part of the first network of interactive 'LiveTouch' screens in the city. (The Edinburgh Reporter features on one of these advertising The Life of Barney Thomson!)

Transport Convener, Councillor Lesley Hinds, said: "These shelters are being installed free of charge to the Council as part of the advertising contract with JCDecaux, who are also carrying out a cleaning programme across many of the city's bus stops.

"One of the great things about the new bus shelters on Princes Street is the phone charging points, which will help those travelling around or visiting the city to stay connected all the time. This will be particularly useful during the Festival, when more people than ever will be passing through Edinburgh."

# Canonmills Bridge campaigners to fight on

×

Despite the fact that the recommendation to the planning committee tomorrow is for the building at 1-6 Canonmills Bridge to be demolished, that decision may be deferred according to the campaigners fighting against it.

In the report before the committee tomorrow there is a condition attached to the recommendation for approval that the matter be referred to Scottish Ministers. That coupled with some support from local councillors may affect the decision.

The Edinburgh Reporter met the campaigners tonight in a local pub where they were meeting to discuss tactics to be used before tomorrow morning's Development Management Sub Committee at the City Chambers.

Their campaign has gathered almost 4000 signatures on an online petition, and this along with their activities on Facebook and other social media has brought the site to public attention.

The shop which is occupied by Earthy at this time is not listed, although it does lie in a conservation area. But the planners believe that the demolition would not 'have an adverse impact on the character or appearance of the conservation area.' In fact the campaigners are not too worried about retaining the building, but they are worried about what might replace it.

Planning permission was already granted in 2009 for the replacement building which is planned to be an L- shape including 2 restaurants, 6 flats and 3 town houses, but now the site owners need permission to demolish the existing

structure.

A total of 117 representations were made to the application to demolish 1-6 Canonmills Bridge including representations from Councillors Hinds and Gardner, although the local community councils did not voice any objections.

Campaigners who are against the demolition of 1-6 Canonmills Bridge met us on the eve of the decision by the City of Edinburgh Development Management Committee as to whether it may be demolished or not. Planning permission for its replacement already exists, but the campaigners feel it is too big for the site and is out of keeping with the buildings around it.

# Scott Allan hands in written transfer request

Scott Allan has handed in a written transfer request but Hibs have issued a statement insisting that he will not be sold to Championship rivals Rangers.

The statement which appeared on the club website just after 6pm reads: "In the face of continued media interest, Hibernian Football Club can confirm that Scott Allan has today handed in a written transfer request. "This comes on the back of two unwelcome and uninvited approaches from Rangers FC regarding Scott, the first for £175,000 and the second for £225,000.

"Hibernian FC has refused both bids because the Club has no wish to transfer a valuable player to strengthen a major rival in the battle to win the Championship and gain promotion to the Premiership.

"Hibernian's position has not changed. The player will not be sold to Rangers."

### Council by-election Leith Walk Ward – Susan Rae

Susan Rae is the Green Party candidate for the Leith Walk Ward at the upcoming by-election in September.

She is a newish member of the political party but is a local person who feels she will be able to help others.

Although there has been a Green councillor in the ward before she recognises that there is everything to fight for here. She said: During the Independence campaign I worked with the Greens and I enjoyed my politics again.

"Here on the ground through my work and through living there I have come to recognise the kind of problems people experience and I think I can help with these. I tend to get things done!

"I think the Walk needs to be more open to cyclists and pedestrians and not as much to heavy traffic." Susan believes that if the tram project is to come down Leith Walk the council have to ensure that all the traders and residents will gain from that and not endure too much more pain.

Susan is originally from Hawick in the Scottish Borders but she has lived in Edinburgh for 9 years and for the last 7 years in Inchkeith Court, just off the Walk. She works part-time with Support@Work (Edinburgh Trade Union Council) as Project Administrator — this project provides advice and support to those not in a Union who are having difficulties in the workplace: not being paid minimum wage, holiday pay, sick pay, coping with disciplinary hearings, advice on the Equality Act 2010 and also training. Her other part-time job is as Training Assistant with Scottish Parent Teachers Council helping to organise training for Parent Councils throughout Scotland which is delivered by a team of Regional Advisors.

Voting will take place on 10 September 2015 from 7:00am till 10:00pm. In 2012 the turnout in this ward was only 36.2%. The four councillors elected were Angela Blacklock (Scottish Labour), Deidre Brock (SNP) Maggie Chapman (Greens) and Nick Gardner (Scottish Labour).

The by-election has been called as a result of two resignations. Councillor Deidre Brock has recently been elected to Westminster as MP for Edinburgh North & Leith and Councillor Maggie Chapman will be standing in next year's Scottish Parliamentary elections in the North East of Scotland.

### Canonmills Bridge decision due tomorrow

×

When the Development Management committee meet tomorrow morning it looks likely that they will grant permission to the owner of 1-6 Canonmills Bridge to demolish it and replace it with a block of flats. Certainly the report before the committee recommends that the application to demolish Earthy is granted.

This decision has saddened the people behind the Save 1-6 Canonmills Bridge campaign. They have gathered almost 4000 signatures on a petition set up <u>here</u> and have other support which they will present in person to the committee on Wednesday morning.

They say they are not giving up the fight yet, despite the recommendation to approve the demolition in a conservation area, at the planning sub-committee meeting tomorrow morning.

Buoyed by public support over the past 6 weeks of their campaign, the campaigners have gathered over 1600 paper signatures from their presence on the bridge at the weekends, and with support of their 1228 followers on Facebook, have also gained nearly 4000 signatures online through their 38degree petition. The paperwork and statistics will be presented to the committee on Wednesday.

In a joint statement, the lead campaign team said, "We have encountered unified support from across the local community (people of all ages and political perspectives), also from regular and occasional visitors to the area. We can't overstate how much the area around Canonmills Bridge junction means to locals, pedestrians on their way to work or the Botanics, and to those frequenting the Water of Leith. We have been heartened by the repeat visits, for progress updates and in encouragement to our stall."

The campaigners say that local councillors Gardner, Bagshaw, Barrie and Hinds have all requested a hearing that can be granted or denied on the day of the meeting, but whatever happens you can guarantee that the locals of Canonmills are not going to go quietly, as on the eve of the meeting they gather their placards and warm up the vocal chords to gather outside the City Chambers tomorrow morning at 9am.

"It ain't over til the big ball swings" said Gemma Kicks a local resident.

# Rental prices increase by a third during the Festival

We are all sure that if you clear your house out and let it out as a Festival let then you can be in the money, but now it has been proved.

A recent study by <u>hometogo</u> has found that in Edinburgh during August the price of renting property goes up by around a third. Prices for a flat for 4 people during July and August have an average price of £175 per night which equates to £1225 per week.

The prices go up most at the end of August and then prices go back to normal (as do all the residents!) in September.

London prices do not enjoy this escalation and remain much more stable throughout the summer months, but Central London prices remain the highest in the UK and about 50% higher than prices in Edinburgh from June to August.

### Scottish Opera to warm up Edinburgh this winter with Carmen

You have to wait till November but Scottish Opera will then be ready to entertain you with Carmen at the Festival Theatre. Their new season will begin with one of the world's best-loved operas: the steamy tale, scandalous heroine and instantly recognisable music make Bizet's *Carmen* a true gem of the operatic repertoire.

This dark and sultry production — by Patrice Caurier and Moshe Leiser (1999) and revived here by director **Benjamin Davis** — evokes the exotic atmosphere of 19<sup>th</sup>century Seville and puts the colourful characters and fantastic singing into intimate focus. *Carmen*'s enduringly memorable music features richly melodic tunes such as the 'Habanera', the 'Seguidilla' and the rousing 'Toreador's Song'.

*Carmen* tells the story of one of the most famous love triangles in the classical music world. When Don José, a naïve, young soldier, meets the alluring and exuberant Carmen, thoughts of marrying his childhood sweetheart are soon forgotten. But Don José is not the only one to fall under Carmen's seductive spell, and when she chooses another man, Escamillo, she sets in motion a shocking and unmissable showdown at the bullfighting arena.

Making her Scottish Opera debut, Lithuanian mezzosoprano **Justina Gringyte** sings the title role, hot on the heels of winning Best Young Singer at the International Opera Awards 2015. Since her time as a Samling scholar and a member of the Royal Opera House's Jette Parker Young Artists Programme from 2011 to 2013, Justina has sung many roles including Maddalena in *Rigoletto* at the Bolshoi Theatre, Fenena in *Nabucco* at Welsh National Opera, Carmen at English National Opera and has gained widespread recognition within the industry.

Also making his debut with Scottish Opera, New York-born tenor **Noah Stewart** sings the role of Don José. Since graduating from The Juilliard School, Noah has established himself as an extremely versatile cross-over artist. As well as singing title roles around the world's great opera houses, he sang back-up vocals for the American rapper **Coolio** and became a Decca recording artist with his debut solo album, *Noah*, which peaked to number 14 on the UK Albums Chart and topped the UK classical music charts for seven weeks in 2012. In early 2015, Noah appeared with English National Opera in *The Indian Queen* and with the Royal Opera House in the role of Pinkerton in *Madama Butterfly*.

To complete the famous love triangle, **Roland Wood** returns to Scottish Opera to sing the role of Escamillo. A former Scottish Opera Company principal, Roland has been highly praised for his portrayal of the Count di Luna in Scottish Opera's production of Verdi's *Il trovatore* (2015) and Oedipus in English National Opera's world premiere of Julian Anderson's *Thebans* (2014).

Joining the trio are former Scottish Opera Emerging Artists Nadine Livingston singing Micaela, Marie Claire Breen and Andrew McTaggart, a chorus of 40, The Orchestra of Scottish Opera, and a 20 strong children's chorus from all over Scotland. Renowned British conductor David Parry brings the fantastically familiar score to life in his Scottish Opera debut.

### Edinburgh Festival Fringe 2015 – James Christopher's Annual Cry for Help

Hello. I'm James Christopher and I'm writing to tell you about my Annual Cry For Help, and hopefully, enlist your help.

This year I will be exploring the performer / audience dynamic. I will attempt to endear myself to the crowd with intelligent and tightly honed routines about politics, popular culture, turning vegetarian, etc – all peppered with my trademark one-liners. Furthermore, my 'cry for help' will extend to audience members, who I'll be enlisting for sound effects and lighting changes (via various torches I will provide. It's Free Fringe after all!)

Being liked is a typically human urge, though perhaps one that performers feel more strongly than most. More specifically comedians — who crave the spontaneous approval of raucous laughter, all the while the centre of attention. So what happens when two comedians are in a relationship? I have the answer!

It's my sixth consecutive solo show, and I've started to notice structural patterns emerging in my shows. Short, sharp jokes and one-liners at the top of the show, building to longer anecdotes and observations. I believe the material has improved year-upon-year, and it becomes possible to say more honest, personal things and take greater risks. Nevertheless, I felt an urge to do something different in terms of the layout of the show. I've accumulated some nice reviews over the years, though many of them seem to mention how 'nice' I am. This is a strangely irksome compliment — as a writer, I want people to find my ideas challenging, surprising, even disturbing, whilst hopefully being relatable. My comedian partner is perceived as being a little more blunt and forthright than I am; so when she accused me of being "too nice" late last year, there seemed an obivous solution. We must write the most offensive, alienating sketch show in the world. We've called it The Walk Out Show.

My previous shows have played out like most Fringe stand-up shows — build an atmosphere of bonhomie, and end on a sense of unity and celebration with the crowd. We're going to subvert the norm by trying to get them to leave. So my last cry for help will be to my partner Maxie Wade, as we attempt to reverse six years of pandering to crowds!

So, that's my 2015 show. I welcome you to it – and challenge you to stay till the end!

First published in magazines in the 1880s, then collated in 1893 anthology Grim Tales, they have since, for the most, been forgotten...until now.

Playwright Philip Meeks weaves Nesbit's own life drama alongside her resolutely domestic terror shorts, imbuing her refined words with a little of her own inner darkness and humour. Meeks recently bagged a Fringe First Award for his play Kiss Me Honey, Honey and was responsible for some of Emmerdale's most heart-thumping moments.
