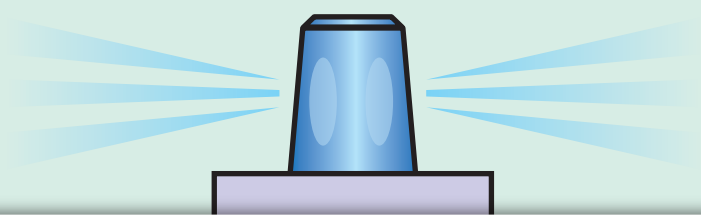

Emergency Admission Rate/Bed days

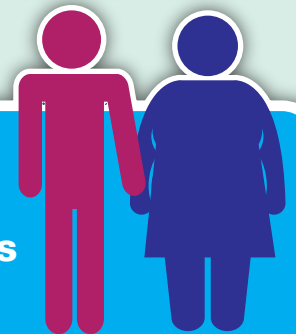
