

Led by saxophonist **Sue Mackenzie**, the summer school is open to all musicians over the age of 14 and you should ideally be around Grade 5 or above on your chosen instrument (although previous experience of playing jazz is not a requirement). The course promises a cross-generational, intensive immersion into the practical aspects of playing jazz, delivered by an expert team of tutors.
