The Soundhouse Winter Festival

The Soundhouse Winter Festival is a new five-day music festival taking place this winter in Edinburgh. Produced by the Soundhouse Organisation it will incorporate performances by some of the very best musicians from Scotland, showcase some of the most exciting newcomers, and offer a full programme of workshops over the weekend.

"In 40 years of festival going I do not think I've ever known a venue to present such a diversity of Scottish musical talent. Not marching bands or lone pipers but gifted performers ranging across genres, all products of our rich musical culture." This was the reaction of Sunday Times journalist Alex Bell to a month of gigs Soundhouse promoted during the Edinburgh Festival 2023. We showcased a whole host of musical acts based in Scotland – across jazz, folk, indy and classical – and audiences loved it.

So when better to repeat the exercise than around St Andrew's Day? We'll have concerts each night from Thursday 28 November to Monday 2 December and daytime events on the weekend. The whole shee-bang will be a Fair Saturday fundraiser, so that any profits will help to support Soundhouse's musical programme in 2025.

Edinburgh-based <u>Victoria Hume</u> is an acclaimed singer-songwriter known for intertwining her musical and professional life – she works as an arts manager in health and medicine and as a researcher. An ambitious, inspiring and thoughtprovoking record unlike anything Lost Map has released before, Radical Abundance is Victoria's new album of absorbing atmospheric alt-folk songs, about the dying days of capitalism and what might emerge next.

Nicole Smit Quintet

Singer <u>Nicole Smit</u> has been wowing Scottish audiences with her uplifting and inspirational performances drenched in the history of the blues since arriving on these shores from Sweden almost a decade ago. Now she turns to the jazzier side with music inspired by Dinah Washington, Etta Jones, Eartha Kitt and Billie Holiday – singers with jazz techniques but also cool, bluesytextured voices. Nicole's eponymous quintet is completed by drummer Vid Gobac, Cameron Bradley on upright, Dave Toule on guitar and Kassandra E'Silva on sax.

McCreadie/Stumbras/Scanroglio/Galeotti

From Scotland to Italy to Lithuania, <u>Fergus McCreadie</u> (piano), <u>Mindaugas</u> <u>Stumbras</u> (guitar), <u>Michelangelo Scanroglio</u> (doublebass) and <u>Mattia Galeotti</u> (drums) have forged a special connection over many years of playing together. Generated initially from a friendship between Mindaugas and Michelangelo, they met in 2018 for the first time in Florence and have since made music many times in their respective countries.

Hannah Lavery's Unwritten Women

Hannah Lavery is an award winning poet, playwright and performer. Acolyte

<u>Acolyte</u> is an Edinburgh-based poetic and psychedelic ensemble, founded in 2018. Described by The Skinny as a 'supergroup', Acolyte is made up of bassist Ruairidh Morrison (The Dark Jokes, The Microband), with synth and backing vocals from Gloria Black (Maranta), percussionist Daniel Hill and fronted by award-winning poet and spoken-word artist, Iona Lee. Acolyte fuse soundscapes with storytelling, hypnotic loops, harmonic depth and existential motifs to create truly unique performances and a genre-defying sound.

Su-a Lee & Friends

<u>Su-a Lee</u> is one of Scotland's most versatile, adventurous and charismatic cellists. Su-a says, "Playing solo is not really my thing. I am energised by working with other people, especially these people." Expect an evening of traditional, and not so traditional tunes.

Callum Easter & the Roulettes

The kind of sunshine that burns and blisters and makes you yearn for a Scottish winter. The kind of heat that snaps guitar strings and loses kilos, that puddles sweat at the feet and makes voices hoarse and makes you yearn for beer. With songs from the new album and a full band, Leith's very own holy Easter will brand his name on your heart. Not one of your washable tattoos. Indelible. Forever dirty.


Gentle Yoga (1.30pm-2.30pm)

Workshop - Book Street Accordian Book Bookbinding with Cass Online, free

Join Cass of Bookbinding with Cass for this free online workshop for adults and children – a fun project that sees a sheet of A4 paper transform into a sculptural street scene, complete with a matchbox book case to store it in. This is an invitation to be inspired by storytelling, books and words, using techniques such as folding, cutting, writing, drawing and sticking to breathe new life into remnant and recycled papers.

Cass's bitesize video tutorials take you through the making process from start to finish with tips and ideas to help you along the way. This project is all about using what you have to hand - the videos give you some ideas of where to find remnant materials to decorate your book and the other tools/materials required should be easy to source if you don't already have them.

Your book can be as simple or detailed as you choose to make it, at a minimum it will take 2 hours and at the max you could spend a whole day or afternoon creating your book. You might want to use this as an opportunity to get creative on your own or why not get together with a group of friends or family to make together and share ideas and materials.

The idea is good and profound and positive and joyful. It is an appropriate idea for young people and for those who feel their mind is young. And those are the ones who set it in motion. This is about discovering the value, the importance and the grace of culture and connecting it with the immense desire for culture of a society that want to be responsible.

Black Friday has its thing and its how and its reason for being. It has managed consumption's vertigo to perfection, manipulating it with an impressive and overwhelming efficacy. It holds its place with a slight – very slight – effort. It leads an unstoppable flow and most of the times it achieves to confuse what we have with what we are. This absurd fever is also part of the human being.

The Fair Saturday movement wants to do just as much in its own way, with other objectives. It wants to take on the world of feelings, of sensations, of ideas, of hope and of some specific dreams that cannot be tackled down or put aside. And for that, the path is quite simple. To fill for one day our venues and every corner of the cities that need to breathe and feed on new winds with cultural activities.

Every last Saturday of November we will have the right to dream together. Choirs, street artists, music bands, theatres, museums, painters, storytellers, poets, sopranos, photographers, dancers, dance schools,... amateur and professional, private and public, from here and there, young and veteran. They will start marching and they will be unstoppable. Artists and cultural organisations from all around the world performing the same day and supporting the social causes they chose. Many things will burst and this will be a sign, maybe definite, that it is possible, definitely possible, to tackle the vulgarity, the narrow-mindedness, the greediness, the routine, the stupidity.

Fair Saturday will end up being a brilliant example of how culture is the only solution to dignify democracy, to generate real wealth and to be able to aspire to a humane future. And the young people and those who feel their minds are young will have won what seemed in the beginning of the adventure – as in every worthy adventure – absolutely impossible.
